THE JUDICATURE (RULES OF COURT) ACT

THE LEGAL PROFESSION (ENROLMENT AND PRACTISING CERTIFICATE FEES)
(AMENDMENT) RULES, 1992

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 4 of the Judicature (Rules of Court) Act, and by virtue of section 4 of the Legal Profession Act, and of every other power hereunto enabling, the following Rules are hereby made:—

1. These Rules may be cited as the Legal Profession (Enrolment and Practising Certificate Fees) (Amendment) Rules, 1992, and shall be read and construed as one with the Legal Profession (Enrolment and Practising Certificate Fees) Rules, 1971 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Rules) and shall come into operation on the 1st day of January, 1993.

2. The Principal Rules are hereby amended by inserting therein, next after Regulation 8, the following:—

“9. Where an attorney is on the Roll of attorneys on the 1st January in any year and was issued a Practising Certificate in the previous year then unless he pays the prescribed Practising Certificate Fee on or before the 28th February in the current year he shall be liable to pay twice the prescribed Practising Certificate Fee unless he proves to the satisfaction of the General Legal Council that he did not practise at any time during the current year prior to the actual date of such payment and shall be presumed to be in breach of the provisions of Canon II (j)

and Canon V(s) in respect of such period in the current year as precedes the payment of the Practising Certificate Fee."

3. Part II of the First Schedule to the Principal Rules is hereby deleted and the following substituted therefor:—

PART II—*Practising Certificates*

(i) Attorneys-at-Law of less than five years standing ..	\$600.00
(ii) Attorneys-at-Law of five years standing but less than ten years, reckoned in the case of those who were formerly barristers or solicitors from the date of admission to practise in Jamaica ..	\$1,200.00
(iii) Attorneys-at-Law of ten years standing but less than fifteen years, reckoned in the case of those who were formerly barristers or solicitors from the date of admission to practise in Jamaica ..	\$1,600.00
(iv) Attorneys-at-Law of fifteen years standing and over, reckoned in the case of those who were formerly barristers or solicitors from the date of admission to practise in Jamaica ..	\$2,000.00
